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PROGRAMME

The Faculty of Built Environment at TH Lübeck, University of Applied Sciences, is hosting an international summer school to explore the current dynamics and challenges affecting our cities today. This year's focus is on how our urban heritage, including the built environment but also cultural, socio-economic and local values, can adapt and evolve in the context of climate change.

Lübeck as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, is an ideal location for this study. In an exploratory format - the *Changing Cities Lab* - Bachelor students from diverse backgrounds are encouraged to conduct research and on-site experiments to develop contextualized adaptation strategies that work with Lübeck's tangible and intangible heritage.

The programme includes theoretical inputs from local experts and international lecturers, as well as workshops to equip the students with methods and tools for change. Working in small groups, the students will first focus on a selected aspect of change before joining their findings and collaboratively developing a strategy or project for one of the case study sites.
